CROSS TRAINING ICU NURSING STAFF TO FIGHT CVICU NURSING SHORTAGES

With the nursing shortage looking like it will never end and heart failure patients continuing to get sicker, it's necessary to get more specialty trained nurses into cardiovascular (CV) intensive care units (ICUs). At an academic medical center in Omaha, Nebraska, the CVICU takes a variety of patients that range from coronary artery bypass and valve replacement patients to those requiring mechanical circulatory support including the left ventricular assist device (LVAD), Impella, and the intra-aortic balloon pump (IABP). Additionally, there are six other intensive care units including Neuro, Surgical, Medical, COVID, Oncology, and Step-Down Progressive Care. To begin increasing the number of CV specialty trained nurses, a group of cardiac care unit nurses were successfully cross trained to the post cardiac surgery unit. Subsequently, CV leadership reached out to staff on all applicable ICUs looking for volunteer nurses who wanted to be cross trained to the CVICU and the response was overwhelming from staff who wanted the opportunity. These ambitious nurses were offered the same orientation as any other nurse new to the CVICU with an orientation about 6 weeks long, including specialized cardiology fellowship classes, and CV device training. Upon completion of orientation, the nurses spend four weeks in the CVICU and then start splitting time between their home unit and the CVICU. Overall, this initiative has been a success ensuring that patient safety and staffing needs are met, nurses are able to grow professionally, and the relationships between units become stronger.
